# *How is OSS created and used ?*

- Communities ! Communities ! Communities !
  - Who participates in these communities ?
  - Is it only communities that make OSS what it is ?
  - Fedora to Red Hat, Ubuntu to Canonical, OpenSuse to Novell ....etc
- Business Models
  - Direct revenue
    - Red Hat, Novell, MySQL
  - Indirect revenue
    - IBM, Dell, HP

# *What are the challenges / barriers to adoption ?*

- Proprietary software is mainstream – In industry and education.
  - Migration is costly and time-consuming
    - Vendor lock-in makes it even more harder
  - Students tend to use what they were taught
- Open Source Business Models not well understood
